Case study:

Securing and Managing Guards' Firearms, G4S at ISCAR LTD



The Problem

ISCAR Metalworking is an Israeli toolmaking company affiliated with one of the world's largest metalworking conglomerates, IMC Group. Since 2006, it is a part of the Warren Buffett's Berkshire Hathaway.

At one of the company manufacturing plants 47 security guards, managed by G4S, need to arrive unarmed, sign on a firearm and return it by the end of their shift.

This requires 24 hours of manager attendance in order to take out each firearm from the safe, sign the guards and make sure that all the firearms are returned by the end of the shift.

The Solution

We offered one ULTRA cabinet with 5 drawers, which in total contains 54 compartments.

Each firearm is secured in a separate compartment while access to each is granted only after biometric identification and according to preset personal authorization.

Each transaction is automatically documented and captured on video.

The system will send real-time alert if one of the firearms isn't returned on time – the alert will be sent to the manager and to the individual guard.







The Result

"Daily life of our security guards and managers has changed since the MATRIX was implemented.

No more manual signing for weapons.

No more managers worried about whether the weapon will be returned at the end of the shift and no more checkups if the license is valid and if the guard is certified.

The system provides a complete solution for the management and handling of weapon storage by all means, through secure storage, selective access, automatic documentation (including video), real time alerts and so much more."
